

Pathways Middle College High School:

A New Concept

Pathways Middle College High School opened in January 2001, with fifteen (15) 8th grade students from south Oklahoma City middle schools and is the only middle college high school in Oklahoma. This innovative choice school's mission is to serve motivated students who express a desire to earn a high school diploma and work toward a college degree while attending high school. Pathways Middle College High School is uniquely designed to serve 8th through 12th grade students who demonstrate willingness to excel by providing numerous learning opportunities for students within the community college setting.

- \Rightarrow Students follow a modified block schedule;
- ☆ Classes are 1 ½ hours in length and meet on alternate days of the week;
- ☆ Classes start at 10:20 am each day and end at 3:50 pm each day;
- ☆ Students are expected to complete 16 hours of community volunteer service each semester;
- ☆ Students follow the Oklahoma City Public School calendar:
- \Rightarrow Students complete the same curriculum requirements that the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education have set out for the OHLAP scholarship program;
- ☆ Students also complete courses in:
 - Spanish and Hispanic Culture
 - Computer Technology
 - Journalism
 - Health/Safety
 - Fine Arts Exploration;
- ☆ Qualified students may start completing courses through dual enrollment to obtain high school and college credit as 11th and 12th graders.

In 10th Grade, students will participate in free ACT testing. Starting with 11th grade, students who qualify may apply for dual enrollment in college-level classes that will count for both high school and college credit, paid for by Oklahoma City Public Schools.
